Citizens Advice in schools project



This Spring we're launching a new initiative to bring a specialist adviser into local schools to help families in need.

The adviser will be integrated into the school support teams, and working closely with identified families, will provide information and assistance on a range of issues, including:

- Navigating welfare benefits and financial entitlements (including the Household Support Fund)
- Accessing charitable support such as food banks and grants
- Addressing debt and budgeting concerns
- Accessing housing support and preventing housing issues
- Understanding employment rights and childcare options
- Improving energy efficiency within the home and accessing energy bill support.

Our community includes a number of families facing financial hardships, housing insecurity, and difficulties in accessing essential services. In the year to March 2023, more than 2,000

children under 16 in the South Hams were living in relative poverty (about one-in-seven children). Many parents and guardians, especially those with limited resources, often lack the time or means to visit our main Follaton office or one of our outreach centres. By placing a Citizens Advice adviser in a school setting, we can bridge this gap, offering convenient and confidential support in a familiar environment.

We will initially be working with <u>Education</u>
<u>South West</u> schools including King Edward VI
Community College in Totnes, Dartmouth
Academy and Kingsbridge Community
College.

Devon Housing survey

We are collecting information on the condition of housing locally. If you rent from a private landlord, your local council or a housing association, would you help us by completing a short questionnaire to share your experience about aspects like repairs and maintenance?

We will analyse all the data and share the results with local MPs, district councils, housing associations and other interested groups – demonstrating the condition of rented housing and the type of problems people are experiencing.

Student Volunteering Week!



In mid-February we joined other organisations across the country celebrating the contribution of our student volunteers.

These volunteers bring so much to Citizens Advice South Hams and we're always blown away by their dedication and hard work.

Many of our student volunteers are law students but we also have a social work student on placement.

Working with Citizens Advice gives students an opportunity to gain real world experience and deepen their understanding of the issues people are facing and how they can be helped. We're proud that many students who begin volunteering often move into employment with us.

Our impact in Totnes

Last year, we helped 648 people living in the Totnes areas with 4,152 advice issues. We have seen a 17% increase in benefits issues compared with the previous year and a 68% increase in charitable support and food bank issues. It is clear that the cost of living crisis is far from over and many people are still struggling.

We continue to have a weekly outreach at St John's Church in Bridgetown every Wednesday morning 9.30am to 12.30pm. If you know anyone who needs support or advice please direct them to our services. All of our advice is free, confidential, independent and impartial.

How our advice helped Sue



Sue lives alone and has severe disabilities. Through our partnership work with Totnes Caring she was identified as someone who needed help filling in benefit application forms as she has a very low income. Our adviser visited her at home as she was unable to get the office. After helping with her the forms, Sue was awarded Attendance Allowance, Pension Credit, and Severe Disability Premium (SDP). Sue now has an extra £8,631 a year coming in

to help her manage.

During our interactions we also established that Sue had storage heaters in her home that we she wasn't sure how to use the properly. Our energy team conducted a thorough energy assessment and advised her on how to effectively use her heaters, and switched her to a cheaper energy tariff. We also provided her with a hot water bottle to help keep her warm throughout the Winter and will continue to work with Totnes Caring to see if there is any additional help she needs.
